Professional body:

any body of expert practitioners in an occupational field, and includes an occupational body

✓ LIASA



CONSIDERATION 3

"Professional designation"

A title or status conferred by a professional body in recognition of a person's expertise and right to practice in an occupational field

✓ PROFESSIONAL LIBRARIAN

- Registration of the individual with a professional body
- Right to practice in a particular field of expertise
- Retention dependent on compliance with professional body requirements
- Registered separately from a qualification
- Verifications of qualifications and designations are the exclusive responsibility of the professional body
- SAQA may deregister a professional designation

IMPLICATIONS FOR LIASA

- Recognised as the national LIS professional body
- Regulate qualifications
 - In consultation with SAQA
 - To ensure core competencies are addressed
- Accredit service providers
 - For CPD
- Determine designations
- Set standards of ethical practice
- Implement and monitor CPD
