LEADERSHIP

The current HELIG National Committee took office at the LIASA Conference in October 2016. At our first meeting, the Additional Members were able to select portfolios or special projects to take on during their term of office.

The Chair Elect is undertaking three special projects - a Salary and Grades Survey; and an Investigation into Web Archiving; and the IFLA Global Vision Survey for HELIG

The HELIG National Committee includes HELIG Convenors, where these have been elected or appointed in the branches. According to the HELIG National Constitution, the HELIG Convenors are ex officio part of the National Committee. The role of the Convenors is to initiate HELIG activities within the Branches, and to be the connection between the Branch and HELIG National.

Several online meetings have already taken place including online meetings with John Williston (University of Adelaide) and Lynne Torres (Monash Australia). Briefly, the way forward would be work on a needs analysis, and based on what comes out of that, identify a framework to work on. The task team would also work with CHELSA on this, but would include stakeholders from TVET, private and community colleges as draft is seen, at this stage, to cover "post-schooling".

- The HELIG Chair and Chair-Elect, as representatives of the Higher Education Library sector, were invited to join SAUSNET (South African Universities Staff Network for Transformation) which was formed mid-November 2016 in response to the continuing crisis in higher education.
- The HELIG Chair represents LIASA in the Higher Education Research Chamber at the ETDP SETA, while Nthabiseng Kotsekoane represents LIASA in the TVET Chamber.

MEMBERSHIP

LIASA – being a membership organisation – relies heavily on new members to join on an annual basis. HELIG relies heavily on membership campaigns by its Branches. No official membership campaigns were launched by HELIG National. Promotional emails were however sent to mailing lists outside LIASA. TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Our focus in this term of office has been on Information Literacy and User Experience.

We are very pleased that Andy Priestner was invited to present a pre-conference workshop on UX, and to provide a keynote at the LIASA Conference. The HELIG Round Table discussion at the Conference this year looks at First Year Experience. Our guest speaker is Dr Annsilla Nyar of the South African National Resource Centre for First Year Students and Students in Transition (SANRC).

The HELIG Information Literacy Task Team is continuing its work to explore a South African framework for IL for Higher Education.

We worked with other national interest groups to offer interesting training and open discussions for our members. We held a joint open discussion with MAIG on Library Orientation at the end of November 2016. Discussions are underway with RETIG to hold open discussions on a number of topics.

Another webinar was "Tips for Publishing" (Part 1) presented by Dr Jaya Raju. Instead of a webinar, Denise Nicholson shared a presentation on "Understanding the SA Copyright Bill".

Something new this year was the creation of an online journal reading club, managed by Theresa Mofana, the Additional Member holding the CPD portfolio. Our webinars have traditionally been free and open to all, not just for LIASA members, but it was decided by the National Committee that the online journal reading club would be a "Members Only" benefit.

There have been two HELIG Reading Club sessions thus far. The first article dealt with Fake News and this led to a compilation of a document that lists resources dealing with Fake News, particular in a South African context. This document is available at https://goo.gl/MYeVUf. The discussion was facilitated by Theresa Mofana. The second article discussed the role of academic librarians embedded in faculty research projects. This discussion was led by Gill Kirchhoff.

The KZN HELIG Branch and the FS HELIG Branch have been active, each holding two activities.

- The KZN HELIG Branch held a branch meeting on 15th March 2017 during which the
 workshops for planned for the year. This was followed by a HELIG seminar on 11 July at
 UniZulu Library. Topics under discussion at that seminar included an overview of open
 access, and Publishing 101. The guest speaker was LIASA Librarian of the Year for 2017,
 Laila Vahed.
- The FS HELIG Branch held two seminars. The topic for the first one was Content
 Development for Webinars on 10 March 2017. The HELIG seminar on Action Research,
 asking critical questions and what it means for the library was held on 8 August 2017. The
 presenter was Prof Wilkinson.
